4. The scope of works requires the Contractor to undertake collection and disposal of hazardous waste from sites.

All collections will be defined and instructed by the Delegated Depot Manager as required. The types of hazardous waste encountered regularly by the Employer include:

- Oil and fuel wastes including waste hydraulic/engine/gearbox/lubricating oils, bilge, waste liquid fuels e.g. waste oil and fuel
 Filters, oil contaminated water from steam cleaner, oil contaminated
 Absorbents, cloths.
- Hazardous empty drums or containers
 - Fluorescent light tubes.
 - Medical waste

The task will involve the collection and transport of hazardous waste and the recycling / recovery / disposal of the waste to a permitted site plus the production of hazardous waste consignment notes. On occasions unidentified hazardous substances may need to be sampled and analysed by the Contractor to enable the waste to be adequately described. Specific Health & Safety Hazards

In addition to the requirements above of the Service Information, the Contractor is informed of the following potential hazards:

Hazardous Waste

Hazardous waste collection, transport and disposal will involve manual handling and exposure to hazardous substances. The Contractor shall have procedures to ensure that their staff uses appropriate PPE, equipment and hygiene techniques to ensure their health and safety

Slips, Trips and Falls

Hazardous waste collection and disposal will often be in areas where slips, trips and falls are more likely to occur. The Contractor shall ensure that all work areas are continually monitored for trip hazards.

Sharps Hazard

The Contractor is likely to encounter Sharps during this work activity and is to ensure all 'sharps', including syringe needles or razor blades, are removed immediately and deposited into an approved 'sharps' container and then disposed of in accordance with current legislation and best practice. Where there is a frequent and regular occurrence of syringes Training and Competency

The Contractor shall comply with the minimum training and competency requirements for the contract works as listed in Part A of the Service Information and ensure all their staff comply with any legal and statutory requirements regarding training and competency. Additionally the following requirements are essential:

 The Contractor must ensure that all staff are trained in the transfer and movement of wastes.

- All staff must understand the emergency procedures to be followed in the event of a health, safety or environmental incident.
- All staff must be trained and be able to recognise different forms of hazardous materials

5. Mandatory Requirements for the waste management contractor

Contractor should provide a valid waste management licence issued by the Agriculture and Rural Development (Pollution and Waste Management Unit) in terms of the National Environmental Management Waste Act (Act No.59 of 2008). Whereby service providers are outsourcing the services to a third party a memorandum of agreement should be accompanied by the licences
